## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **Approval of previous meeting minutes:**

A motion to approve the last meeting minutes was made by Mike Haigler, Van Frazier seconded. No discussion. Motion approved by majority.

**Hazmat Call Report: 48 calls total from July 1 to December 31, 2018 – listed below will be only the significant calls for the time period.**

**HazMat calls – 3 1 significant**

07-19-18 - 235 Curtis, Evansville Town Hall. An envelope with white powdery substance found in the building, building secured, Homeland Security, RERT2, FBI, EMA and local agencies responded determined it was antacid medication.

**Fuel Spills – 13 calls 1 significant**

08-06-18 – 55 Salt Creek – Semi hit a deer and was leaking fuel. 50 gallons of diesel in lot and trail down Salt Creek.

**Gas Leaks – 25 calls 2 significant**

10/02/2018 – 60 Magnolia – Gas leak at Shepherd of the Valley, construction taking place and unsure if a gas line was hit. Residents evacuated from Shepherd of the Valley and roads blocked. Black Hills and Fire dept. responded.

11/08/2018 – 2451 Shattuck – Sagewood School – construction workers hit a gas line, students evacuated, Fire dept. and Black Hills responded.

**RERT 2:**

There was no report given from RERT 2 as there was no representative from RERT2.

**Facilities Report:**

EMA is still waiting to receive the 2018 Tier II information.

**Information Dissemination**

This fall there was a situation with a pipeline and some possible vandalism where EMA had been notified and was asked to pass information on to local agencies. It became evident that the 1-800 numbers are not the best and there needs to be a local list for emergency contacts developed. Bob Dundas, with True, offered to help Stacy with collecting information.

**Long Term Power Outage and Critical Infrastructure Survey**

The State is requesting there be an Annex added to the Emergency Operation Plan for a Long Term Power Outage. Lt. Harlin is currently working on identifying Critical Infrastructure within the community and will be sending out a Critical Infrastructure Survey to certain community agencies. The information from the survey will be used to help create the Annex. This will be discussed in more detail at the next LEPC meeting.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**Commodity Flow Study:**

The study was completed and the LEPC has access to it. There is also a Commodity Flow Study for Burlington Northern Railroad that is available to LEPC.

**Hazard Mitigation Plan:**

Hazard Mitigation Plan was approved and all local agencies received copies.

**Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan:**

The Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan has been completed and approved by FEMA. It has been sent to the County Commissioners and is pending approval there. Once that is completed it will be sent to local agencies for their adoption.

**Emergency Operations Plan:**

The plan has been approved by all jurisdictions.

There was no further old business and the meeting was adjourned.
